

Jennifer Parr

Jennifer was a 4 year varsity starter for Carlisle in basketball. During that time she scored 977 points, dished out 360 assists and had 222 steals. In 1995, her sophomore year, she helped lead her team to their best season, winning 20 games, the SWBL, as well as Sectional and Divisional Championships. Some individual honors during her career include District 15 Underclassman Player of the Year, 1st Team all SWBL, Honorable Mention All-State, 2 Time Star Press Player of the Year, Middletown Journal, Franklin Chronicle and Dayton Daily News All Area 1st Team, Edna Chamberlain Award and Marine Corps Distinguished Athlete Award. Her junior year she averaged 15.5 points per game 4.5 assists and shot 38% from the 3-point line. Her senior year she averaged 15 points per game, 5 rebounds and 4 assists. She is currently Carlisle's all-time leader in assists and second in steals.

After graduating high school in 1997, Jennifer received a full basketball scholarship to Xavier University. Her team played in 1 NIT tournament and 3 NCAA tournaments during her 4 years. While playing at Xavier University, she started 34 games her senior year and helped lead her team to the programs best season ever, finishing 31-3. Xavier made it to the NCAA Elite 8 that season, after beating the University of Tennessee in the Sweet 16. Her best game was against the University of Dayton where she hit a career high six 3-pointers for 18 points. Jennifer averaged 6.7 points per game, 2.6 assists and shot 42% from the 3-point line her senior season at Xavier. She also received the award for distinguished community service while a student athlete at Xavier University.

After graduating from Xavier, Jennifer coached varsity girls' basketball at Colerain, Middletown and Madison High School.
