



Ticketing & Athletic Event Managment Plan - Fall 2020

- These restrictions apply to both middle school and high school SWBL athletic events.
- These restrictions apply to soccer, volleyball and JV football. Varsity football is outlined below.
- Tickets are not available to the general public, only to athletes' families.
- The home fans will only sit on the designated home side and visitors will only sit on the designated visitor side.
- Everyone, besides administration and support staff, must buy a ticket.
- Support staff who are on the pass list are admitted free, but will not receive extra tickets.
- Administration will be admitted free, plus one.
- SWBL Lifetime Passes and local senior citizen passes will not be accepted.
- Families and close contacts are encouraged to travel, enter and exit the venue together
- Families are required to sit together.
- Everyone will sit with their family/close contacts. No student sections of any kind.
- No standing except on the fence line and roaming around the facility.
- Children under two years of age will not need a ticket and need to stay with their parents at all times.
- Media and college coaches are welcome and will not count in either team's total fans.
- Masks
 - Masks will be required at all times, including when sitting in bleachers with family/close contacts (per Governor DeWine's directions).
 - Coaches and support staff must wear a mask at all times.
 - Masks should be worn by all players whenever they are not in the game.
- Schedule Flexibility
 - Schools will be extra flexible when rescheduling games.
- League Championship Determination
 - League Championships will be determined by divisional record.
 - Note: Ties may happen due to a team(s) not being able to play a full schedule.
- Tickets
 - Ticket availability will be determined by venue based on capacity.
 - Some venues will only be able to accommodate one ticket per athlete or band member.
 - Volleyball (MS & HS) & Soccer
 - Schools will send soccer and volleyball rosters ahead of the game.
 - Each player is allotted a set number of tickets.
 - The ticket person will mark off the roster as people buy tickets.
 - Schools can handle home tickets however they want.
 - The home team and away team are allotted the same number of tickets.

■ Football

- The athletic directors will determine at least one week before the game how many tickets each school will get based on stadium capacity and the number of kids on the roster/number of coaches.
- The number of tickets available will be based on the Governor's Health order.
- The visiting school is responsible for managing ticket sales for visiting fans and the home school is responsible for managing ticket sales for home fans.
- The visiting school will get tickets from the host school.
- The visiting school is responsible for selling all of the visiting tickets
- Only varsity cheerleaders will cheer at the varsity football games and only JV cheerleaders will cheer at the JV football games.
- No visiting bands.
- All ticket sales will be pre-sale only, no sales at the game.
- Football ticket sales will stop 48 hours before the game.
- The visiting AD will communicate to the host AD how many tickets are still unsold 48 hours before the game.
- The visiting school will send the money from ticket sales to the host school.

Volleyball

• The visiting team and home team will not switch sides or benches.

Football

- Half time will only be 10 minutes long.
- The "Hello" cheer will be done at a minimum distance of 10 feet.
- An outdoor area will be provided for teams to meet pre-game, half-time and post-game.
- Locker rooms will be provided for restrooms only.
- Visiting fans and home fans will be provided separate entrances, when possible.
- Visiting coaches' families will not receive free tickets.
