
Please be looking for more information to come home with your child about this exciting program that we will be fully implementing during the 2021-2022 school year.





New School Year—New Programs

From the Department of Curriculum, instruction & Gifted Services

We are so excited to get started with the 21-22 school year. We reviewed many programs during the 20-21 school year and will be implementing a few of those this school year. Eureka Math will now be utilized in grades 1-5. Eureka is a nationally renowned program and we feel it will help our students grow a great deal. Additionally, we will be implementing Interactive Science in grades 2-8 for the 21-22 school year. Like Eureka, Interactive Science is a nationally renowned program. It's been many years since we have implemented new science material in our elementary grades and our teachers are anxious to get started with it. Lastly, we are implementing Edmentum/Exact Path for the 21-22 school year. This outstanding program will assist us in identifying strengths and weaknesses of our students and will help us in establishing benchmarks for them as well as interventions to aide them in reaching those benchmarks. The 21-22 school year is shaping up to be an incredible year with many exciting changes. As always, thank you for your continued support of your child's education.

Carlisle Local Schools Restart Plan – 2021/2022 School Year

As we look to the beginning of the upcoming school year, we want to make sure that all of us are on the same page as far as procedures and expectations for our return to school.

We plan to be 100% in-person for the coming school year. In order to do that, we will continue to comply with any and all guidelines and health mandates from the Warren County Health Department, the State of Ohio Health Department, the Governor's Office, and/or the Ohio Department of Education. The following are what we will be looking at as we start back on August 16, 2021:

- At this time, we anticipate that we will be mask optional, but recommended as per the CDC guidelines, in the building for all students and staff.
- We expect all students and staff to conduct self-wellness checks prior to coming to school each day. If there is any question as to your health status, we ask that you not take the chance of coming into the building. We will monitor all students and staff and follow all protocols to address any incidents.
- We will be maintaining two clinics, as we did last year, to assure that any exposure can be kept to a minimum and all health issues are addressed appropriately.
- We will be keeping strict seating charts for buses, classes, lunches to enable us to do any contact tracing necessary. We will use this information to inform students, parents, and staff of any exposure, as well as any quarantining. Quarantining will be based upon the latest guidelines under which we are working when school resumes.
- We will continue to have hand-sanitizing stations throughout the building and will continue to clean our building with the same attention to detail as we did last year.
- We will promptly notify everyone of any updates to health orders or directives as soon as they are received. We will assure that we will continue to keep the lines of communication open and hope that you will contact us with any questions and concerns that you have for us.
