Back-to-School Family Checklist

All Parents/Caregivers

• Make sure required and recommended immunization are up to date (especially incoming kindergarten, 7th and 12th graders)

• Review hygiene tips to prevent spread of infections.

• Establish a bedtime and wake up time to ensure adequate and consistent sleep.

• Develop a routine for homework and afterschool activities.

• Eat breakfast each at home or school.I

• Help make appropriate clothing choices (wear comfortable clothes, and safe shoes)

• Keep an open line of communication with your child to ensure that he/she maintains safety at school. Talk to teachers as soon as possible if issues occur.

• Get to know specialized instructional support staff for your child, title teachers, interventional specialist, school nurse, school counselor.

• Know your schools policy on when to keep your child home if they are sick and make arrangements in case your child becomes sick at school.

• Keep all emergency contacts up to date with the office.

• Apply for free/reduced lunch for the current school year.

Contact the school social worker if you have needs

IF your Student Has a Health Concern

Make your child's health concern known to the school and school nurse.

Bring current, signed health care provider orders for treatments and all medications given at school. Bring medical supplies and medications in the original containers.

Complete health plans or emergency actions plans with the school nurse if needed.

Keep all contact information up to date.

Make a plan for someone to pick your student up from school in the event he/she needs to come home early! Introduce yourself to the school nurse!

FOOD SERVICE NOTES

Can you believe that summer is almost over?!? We are only a few weeks away from another school year. Your Carlisle Schools Food Service Dept is working hard over the summer preparing for the 2022-2023 school year. Working with our suppliers and our state agency, we are gearing up for another healthy choice meal program.

Once again, there are many changes. This year it has been announced by the USDA that Breakfast and Lunch will **not** be free. So, to be able to qualify, each family will need to turn in a **new application** that can be found with the **Final Forms** that all families are to fill out for school (Check on the <u>Carlisleindians.org</u> web site). You may also get a copy of the application in your school's office at the beginning of the school year. These forms are so important, because they don't just determine eligibility for free and reduced meals at school. They also aid us in identifying those students that need help with school fees, they are used in determining PEBT payments, Title 1 funding for the schools, and other programs that are available to support access to quality education for all of our students.

The food we serve meets the state and federal requirements, which are based on the USDA Dietary Guidelines and Smart Snack guidelines. We also work hard to make meals that our students enjoy and help them thrive in their academic work. Meal prices for the 2022-2023 school year will be \$3.00 for Jr/Sr High School Students. \$2.50 for Elementary. Reduced price is .40 cents. Breakfast for All students is \$1.50 and .30 cents for reduced.

<u>PBIS and Social Emotional Learning Working Together at Carlisle Elementary</u> <u>School (PS-6)</u>

We are excited for the 2022-2023 school year. Our elementary continues to implement PBIS (Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports) and, along with our Elementary Counselor Mrs. Traci Reilich, we are also introducing the Second Step curriculum this school year to help teachers introduce social emotional learning in their classrooms. Social Emotional Learning is a fairly new concept whose implementation is required for all Ohio schools. However, in Carlisle, we have been implementing these standards for several years. Social Emotional Learning standards focus on educating all students on how to build positive relationships with peers, self-awareness, and self-growth. Our goal is to help all students learn, grow, and succeed with academics and with their character development. Our PBIS incentives help motivate students to make good choices based on our three big, overarching district goals of being **RESPECTFUL**, **RESPONSIBLE**, and **SAFE** at all times. We also introduce and focus on character words each month. We have included the list at the bottom of this article (if you'd like to talk about them with your child at home during that month). The entire staff tries to focus on PBIS and positive strategies to make sure that all students are achieving at their highest levels in all areas at school. In addition to the monthly character words, we have included some important dates (pertaining to the start of school) that all parents should know.
