The Carlisle School Community would like to take this opportunity to say good-bye to a strong supporter of the school system and a great citizen of Carlisle, Mr. Jimmy Allen. We all lost a great deal when he passed away this April. He was a friend to all he met, and he reminded everyone, on more than one occasion, to just call him, "Jimmy." I, myself, was chastised more than once for calling him, "Mr. Allen."

He was a 1966 alumnus of Carlisle High School and worked for Appleton Paper in West Carrollton prior to taking on many roles within education. He was active in many community organizations such as the Carlisle Athletic Boosters, the Carlisle Lions Club, the Carlisle Historical Society. Jimmy was also an active member of the Masonic Lodge #482, Farmersville; the United Steel Workers Union, and Berachah Church, Middletown. He was a member of the Carlisle Board of Education and a member of the Warren County Educational Service Center Governing Board. Jimmy served for 25 years in public education, serving on the Carlisle school board for 10 years before being elected to the ESC governing board. He was instrumental in helping to pass a bond levy that allowed the district to build the new K-12 building, which we have had the pleasure of enjoying for the past 2 years.

As a tribute to all that he was to Carlisle, the school and the community, Jimmy was named grand marshal of the 2021 Carlisle Railroad Days Festival and Parade. He will be greatly missed, and we are thankful for all that he gave to us.

It is difficult to believe that another school year has come and gone. I want to take this time to thank everyone who made this past year such a wonderful and successful year. It was a great Carlisle team effort, in which the students, the staff, the parents, and the entire school community worked together to make it happen. For the past two years, the USDA has offered each child across the United States free Lunch and Breakfast at no charge. The waivers that allowed this will expire on June 30, 2022. This means that starting next school year, 2022-2023, the Child Nutrition programs across the nation will return to normal, pre-pandemic operations. Families will once again be asked to complete and submit a current school year Free/Reduced Meal Application. 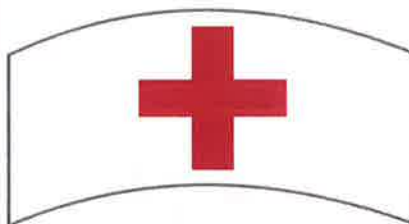

Nurse Notes

ATTENTION

KINDERGARTEN PARENTS

All incoming kindergarteners must have the following vaccines prior to starting school:

5-DPT (last dose after age 4)

4-Polio (last dose after age 4)

3-Hepatitis B

2-Chicken Pox (varicella)

2-MMR

Any student not up to date will be excluded from school starting September 9th, 2022 with all absences unexcused.

ATTENTION 7TH GRADE PARENTS

The Ohio Department of Health is now requiring that your child receive a **Tdap** (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis) vaccine **AND** a meningococcal vaccine **prior to entering 7th grade**. If your child has already received these vaccines, please send in a copy of their record so that we can update your child's record. Any student who has not received the TDAP and Meningococcal vaccines by September 6th, 2022, will be excluded from school and all absences are considered unexcused.

ATTENTION 12TH GRADE PARENTS

The Ohio Department of Health is now requiring that your child receive an additional Meningococcal vaccine prior to entering 12th grade. The vaccine must be given after the 16th birthday. Please submit your students updated immunization record to the office as soon as possible. Any student who has not received this immunization by September 6th, 2022 will be excluded from school and all absences are considered unexcused. Shot records may also be faxed to 937-746-0512. Well checks and Primary Care Doctors

Today you can find a minute clinic, urgent care or emergency room on every corner and these are great resources for busy lifestyles and urgent needs. However, it is very important to a child's growth and development to have a primary care pediatrician or physician. Children should be seen annually for well checks by the same primary care doctor, at these checks their immunizations are reviewed and annual physicals are performed. Being evaluated by the same physician each year allows your child's records to be consistent which can prevent over or under vaccinations and overall health and wellness consistency for your child. Carlisle High School is focused on serving our community and preparing our students for life after high school. During the months of May, June, and July, we have a plethora of activities occurring:

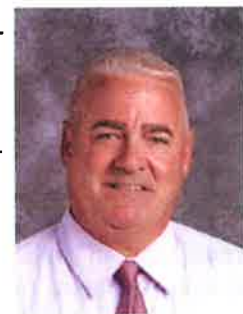

Carlisle Elementary School – Mr. Milner, Principal (Preschool – 3rd Grade)

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2022-2023 - Parents, if you will be registering a child for Kindergarten for the 2022-2023 school year, you need to complete the registration process online through Final Forms. Please visit the Carlisle Local Schools website (at www.carlisleindians.org). Along the top of the home page, please click 'Enrollment' and follow the directions. If you have any questions or problems, please call the school at (937) 746-8969 to speak with Mrs. Casson, the Attendance Secretary.

In order for a child to be eligible to attend Kindergarten during the 2022-2023 school year, he/she must be 5 years of age on or before August 1, 2022.

You will be able to submit all documents online and will NOT need to make an appointment to come in to the school. In order to complete the registration process, you will need to submit the following items (online): your child's birth certificate, any applicable custody papers, shot/immunization records for your child, parent/guardian driver's license, and proof of residency within the district (**ONE** of the following: Rent/Lease Agreement, Mortgage Account Statement/ Mortgage Coupon Book, Settlement Statement, Copy of Deed, Land/Purchase Contract).

Carlisle Indians are Respectful, Responsible, and Safe

Carlisle Intermediate School is working hard to ensure that all students are respectful, responsible, and safe at school. At the beginning of each school year, all classrooms and common areas build their expectations around the three main core values of being respectful, responsible, and safe. We also practice what these words look like and sound like in each area of the building. We also have quarterly rewards if students do well following directions and completing classwork during the quarter. Students could also earn a gold coin to turn into the office for a weekly drawing to earn a bag of chips if they went above and beyond with their behavior, attitude, or grades. Our wonderful PTO helps support this effort by purchasing the chips.

We also focus on a different character word each month in grades K to 6 during morning announcements and throughout the building. Mrs. Reilich, our school counselor, creates a bulletin board each month to focus on our monthly word. She also gives staff members "Hooray" slips if they witness a student demonstrating the monthly character word then the student may be submitted in the character word box for the month. Students earn a certificate and small treat if they are selected for the monthly reward. Mrs. Reilich also started this initiative to help make sure students are practicing the monthly character words daily at school.

All of these initiatives are under a framework called PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports). We work diligently to educate all students with academics and to help them make good choices with behavior. The staff and students love earning the quarterly rewards and other incentives when things go well. If a student does not make a reward then we ask them to reflect on what they could do differently the next time to earn it. As a community, we should continue to build on the school's momentum to help make Carlisle the best community in Ohio with citizens that are respectful, responsible, and safe.
