

**Student is determined to be in close contact with a positive case at school or school event
only**

(Direct contact definition: within 3ft without a mask for more than 15minutes)



**Quarantine options below
(parents/students will choose option A, B, C, OR D)**

- A. Standard Quarantine (10 days)-Student at home, schoolwork done virtually
- B. Standard Quarantine-7 days with a negative test on day 5 or later-Student at home schoolwork done virtually
- C. Mask and Stay option-14 days student wears mask stays in school
 - a. May exit quarantine procedures with a negative test on day 5 or later and after 7 days of quarantine
- D. Test to play-Wears mask when able (bus, sidelines, anytime it will not interfere with breathing)
Student able to attend school and all activities.
 - a. Student must test negative upon exposure notification
 - b. Student must test negative again on days 5-7.
 - c. Student may exit quarantine after 7 days

COVID exposures that are not school related only (not exposed at school or school activity)

Quarantine Options Below



- 1. Standard Quarantine (10 days)-Student at home, schoolwork done virtually
- 2. Standard Quarantine-7 days with a negative test on day 5 or later-Student at home schoolwork done virtually

About the Pilot

10 Warren County school districts participated in the 4-week Test & Stay pilot program with the Warren County Combined Health District and with assistance from the Ohio Department of Health. Participating districts included Carlisle Local Schools, Clinton-Massie Local Schools, Franklin City Schools, Kings Local Schools, Lebanon City Schools, Little Miami, Mason City Schools, Monroe City Schools, Springboro, Wayne Local Schools, the Warren County Career Center and the Warren County Educational Service Center.

During the pilot:

- 790 Warren County students were identified as direct contacts at school (156 CLS students)
- 457 Warren County students participated in the program (48 CLS students)
- 335 Warren County students completed the 7-day program with negative tests and no symptoms (39 CLS students)
- 106 Warren County students are still in the program
- 12 Warren County students had a positive test result after the first test (2.63% of program participants)
- 4 Warren County students had a positive test result after the second test (0.88% of program participants)
- 3,370 days of in-person learning were saved
